

Lateral Flow Test Reporting

Confirmatory PCR testing following a positive result on a lateral flow device (LFD) have been temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11 January. This means that for all education and childcare settings, students who have tested (either at home or through ATS) and reported a positive LFD result will no longer be advised to get a PCR test.

All lateral flow tests (negative or positive) must be reported using the 2 links below. Pupils should share their result, with Test and Trace to help with contact tracing.

Reporting your result helps the NHS monitor the spread of the virus, combat the virus and save lives. It also enables support to be given to communities across the UK.

ParentPay - Cypad (School Dinners)

We are pleased to tell you that Cypad is up and running and you are now able to choose, book and pay for meals online, ensuring your child receives the meal you have chosen for them each day. It's great to see so many parents already logging in and using the system, but could we ask the parents who haven't ordered school meals via Cypad to start doing so.

This is the system we will be using moving forward to ensure the kitchen receives accurate daily figures; therefore it is imperative you log your child into the new system to ensure they receive their hot dinner. You can pay weekly, monthly, or half-termly in advance. If your child is absent from school, the money will remain as a credit on your account.
