

Creative Curriculum Our new learning journey takes us around the globe to explore climate zones. Our main focus is global warming and climate change, thinking about the effects and what might be able to be done to combat it. Learning in different curriculum areas will be linked, in this short but busy half term!

English Our writing this term begins with poetry inspired by climate disasters. We will write similes, metaphors and use alliteration and personification. Next, after reading about inspirational climate activists, we will plan our own persuasive speech

Dedicated grammar and spelling lessons continue each week as well as Guided Reading sessions.

Maths Fractions is the major topic this half term, including mixed and improper fractions, comparing and ordering, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting and finding fractions of amounts. This will then lead us into decimals.

Please can we ask for your support in practising times tables at home, as little and often is the key to the children becoming fluent with multiplication and division facts. If you have any questions about the national times table test, please ask.

Science Our Living Things topic includes classification, habitats, food webs and chains. Much of our scientific work this term will be linked to our Creative Curriculum journey, as we investigate the effects of changing environments on the natural world.
