Creative Curriculum: This half term, we will explore the geographical causes of earthquakes, mountains and volcanoes. We will consider the impact of volcanic eruptions on humans and the surrounding area, focusing in particular on one particular day in Pompeii, in 79AD. Much of our learning across our creative curriculum will be linked to this tragic moment in history. We will be creating 'volcanic soundscapes' and landscapes in both music and art lessons. We hope the children enjoy this explosive half term!

English: We shall begin with dialogue writing, linked to the story of the last supper Next, we commence our 'narrative immersion' (drama) unit based on the book: 'Escape From Pampeii'. The children will write from first person perspectives, producing a diary entry and a monologue. We hope, to perform these monologues.

PSHE: In circle time, we will focus on how to keep our minds and bodies healthy. We will look at balanced diets, healthy eating, how to detect early signs of minor illnesses and when to visit the doctor. We will finish off the term looking at homophobic bullying.

Maths: We will complete our learning of fractions, before exploring decimals. We will then move onto studying money and time.

Computing: We will finish the term making animations using Purple Mash, after learning about how to use search engines and spreadsheets effectively.
