Leave of Absence Forms

If your child needs time off from school for any reason, e.g. entrance exams, appointments (not medical), funerals etc. please complete a 'Leave of Absence' form, proof of the absence and return it to school in a timely manner. This can then be added to the register for the Education Welfare Service and will avoid any unnecessary phone calls to you.

The school office need this information **NOT** class teachers as they track attendance and absences across school. Teachers are welcome to be informed however all requests and paperwork **MUST** be done through the office.

Unfortunately, failure to do this could lead to an unauthorised absence and a fine.

Reminders

Please try to arrange appointments, such as routine dental check ups, outside of the school day.

If you need to sign your child into or out of school using the 'Inventry system', please type the reason CLEARLY and ACCURATLEY as it forms part of the school record for the Education Welfare Service

The car park is for STAFF only who arrive before the children and depart after the children. Parents must use the Heaton's Sports Club opposite school. More parents are driving into the carpark which is extremely dangerous. Several cars backed out of the carpark when the fire alarm sounded this week, narrowly missing staff and children.

Pick up times—please make sure you know what time your child finishes school. 3.15pm Year R-2 and 3.20pm Year 3-6.


Out of 325 entries, 50 were chosen to exhibit in the shop including 12 winners

Free School Meals

Have you applied for free school meals?

There are two types of free school meals— Universal Free School Meals (UIFSM) and Benefit Free School meals.

UIFSM are for any child in Key Stage 1 which is Reception to Year 2. Benefit Free School meals are for any child in school.

You can apply for free school meals if you receive:

- Income Support
- Universal Credit (provided your household income is less than £7,400 a year after tax and not including any benefits you get.
- income related Employment and Support Allowance
- income based Job Seekers Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit only with an income of less than £16,190
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit

The difference between the two for schools is school will receive extra funding year on year with Benefit Free School meals With UIFSM there is no extra funding.
