#### **Library Books**

They can change them as soon as they have read them. We ask that you read with them at least 4 times a week. They will also be listened to in school as part of reading practise.

### Little Wandle phonics books.

These will be given out on a Friday and must be returned on a Monday.

## **Phonics and Spelling**

Spellings and phonics are really important so if you wish to do some extra practise with your child we have put the common exception words, tricky words and phonics mats into their reading record. These will be tested at random points in the year to check children's progress.

### PE
