#### **Medical Appointments**

As you have been informed via Parentmail since returning to school, new government guidance has changed regarding absences from school.

With this in mind, please could you try and make routine medical appointments, such as the dentist, in the 13 weeks of school holidays or after school.

**Remember**—90% attendance equates to half a day's absence each week!

#### Reminders

If your child has vomited or has diarrhoea, please keep them off school for 48 hours from the last episode. We have had a number of incidences recently where children have been sick at home but sent into school where they are sick again. This spreads bugs and staff have to deal with cleaning which takes them from the rest of the class.

Please think of others before you send your child into school.

Please remember when you are sending a packed lunch or treats for the class when it is your child's birthday, this is a nut free school. There are children in school with severe allergies.

All forms for medicine, walking home etc are on the school website. They can be completed and emailed to the office staff.

Please try to arrange appointments, such as routine dental check ups, outside of the school day.

If you need to sign your child into or out of school using the 'Inventry system', please type the reason CLEARLY and ACCURATLEY as it forms part of the school record for the Education Welfare Service

The car park is for STAFF only who arrive before the children and depart after the children. Parents must use the Heaton's Sports Club opposite school. This includes when children are dropped off or collected for appointments or Branching Out.

More parents are driving into the car park which is extremely dangerous.

Pick up times—please make sure you know what time your child finishes school. 3.15pm Year R-2 and 3.20pm Year 3-6.
