Science

This term we will be looking at animals through classifying living things into broad groups. We will carry out investigations about micro-organisms and explore our local habitats, including our class tree.

Homework

Challenge 3:- To create a research project relating to a chosen King or Queen- presenting your findings through a range of ways e.g. poems, a story, paintings, models, non-chronological reports etc. Please be as creative as you can. This will be due in for the week beginning 14th July.

Creative Curriculum

This half term our topic is called 'Lasting Legacy'. In this topic, we will be looking at leaders from around the world as well as focusing on British Monarchs throughout the ages. Our main study in class will be the study of 'Queen Victoria' and the impact her legacy had on aspects of British history such as advances in technology during the 'Industrial Revolution' and the expansion of the 'British Empire'.

The children will also choose their own monarch to research and will ultimately produce a research project about their reign.

Maths
